### **Community Housing Project**

Thanks to the efforts made by the Community Recovery Team, CHYBA and other local organizations have begun building homes as part of the Carr Fire recovery effort. During the past few months, students worked on their first home as part of the Carr Fire recovery. The home is projected to be completed by early 2020. This housing project is both to help those who lost their homes during the 2018 wildfires, and it's also a great training opportunity for local at-risk youth to learn on-theiob trade skills.

This line of volunteer work helps encourage more youth to enter the trades. Zach, a CHYBA Sophomore, noted at the skills he's learning through his volunteer work with CHYBA. "I think the best part about building the home was helping out the community and having skills to use in the rest of my life." Students have had the opportunity to work alongside skilled construction workers to learn different aspects to house building, including foundation work and installing insulation.

Two AmeriCorps Members who Completed their Year of Service

CHYBA had two AmeriCorps members complete their service during the 2019-2020 school year. Julia Fox, an AmeriCorps VISTA who works at the school, completed her year of service in November. Tyler Felton, a CHYBA senior, completed all 450 hours of his community service in November as well. Since the AmeriCorps program opened for students in 2017, CHYBA has had over two dozen students enrolled in the program to provide volunteer service to their community. Since implementing AmeriCorps at CHYBA, students have completed a total of 3681 hours of community service. The majority of service this year has been to help the Shasta County community recover from the Carr Fire.
